MEMBER GUEST CARDS

Your donation should be returned with the form found on page 7. All cards of admission will be mailed during the week of August 16. Please do not request guest cards for non-family members. Temple members who want to attend services with their non-affiliated family members may use their cards to attend services at Fourth Presbyterian Church or the 9:00 pm Late Service at Sinai if space is available.

COMMUNITY SERVICES CARDS

The community is invited to join us for High Holy Days Services held at Fourth Presbyterian Church, located at Delaware Place and Michigan Avenue. If you know anyone who is interested in attending these services encourage them to stop by the Temple office to purchase cards of admission. Cards will be available during regular business hours beginning Monday, August 16 and continuing through Tuesday, September 7. The Temple office will be open on September 1, 2 and 7 until 7:00 pm. The suggested donation for each card of admission is \$400, which supports the year-round programs and activities of our Congregation. RECITAL OF CLASSICAL MUSIC

As has been our tradition for several years, a concert of classical music will be presented on Yom Kippur afternoon, Saturday, September 18 at 2:30 pm at Sinai. This year we are again delighted to welcome Qing Hou, violinist with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, and her husband, Lawrence Neuman, violist with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

A native of China, Qing Hou came to the United States as a full scholarship student of Sylvia Rosenberg at the Peabody Conservatory, where she earned a Bachelor of Music degree. Hou then studied with James Buswell at the New England Conservatory, receiving a Master of Music degree in 1994. In 1997 Daniel Barenboim appointed her to the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

Lawrence Neuman has been a member of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra since 1991. Before coming to Chicago, he was violist with the Miami String Quartet. He has performed as soloist with the National Repertory Orchestra, the National Orchestra of Costa Rica, the Kammergild Chamber Orchestra, and the Eastman-Dryden Orchestra. As a chamber musician he is heard frequently throughout the Chicago area and has performed across the United States and Europe.

YOM KIPPUR FOR INTERFAITH FAMILIES

With Rabbi Levinsky

Many of the traditions of Yom Kippur—fasting, confessing of inadvertent sins, confessing of other people's sins—can be problematic for Jew and non-Jew alike. This makes it difficult for Jews and non-Jews in interfaith families to observe Yom Kippur with heart and meaning. The Jew may find herself defending practices about which she feels less than stellar herself. The non-Jew may be hesitant to question practices he perceives as integral to his partner's faith. In this one session class, we will openly discuss some of these traditions, comparing them to similar Christian traditions and seeking to safely discuss questions about and problems with some of the beliefs and practices of Yom Kippur. Everyone is welcome. The class will meet on Sunday, September 12 at 10 am.

BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

Throughout the world Jews remember their departed ones during the High Holy Days. Chicago Sinai Congregation observes this tradition by preparing an annual Book of Remembrance which is distributed during the Yizkor Service on Yom Kippur, Saturday, September 18. We consider it equally appropriate to remember Jewish and non-Jewish departed loved ones at this season. If you would like to include the name(s) of your departed family members or friends in the Temple's Book of Remembrance please complete the form found on page 9 of this booklet. Return the form along with your donation to the Temple office. To be included in the Book of Remembrance, requests must be received no later than Tuesday, August 10.

CHILDCARE

We offer childcare for members' children ONLY (ages 0-9) for the 5:00 pm services on Rosh Hashanah Eve and Kol Nidre, as well as from 10:30 am to the end of Morning Services on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur Day. We will not be able to accommodate children who are not pre-registered. To maintain appropriate child-staff ratios no exceptions will be made. Please return the registration form found on page 8 of this booklet along with your payment.

The cost for childcare is \$15/child per day. Please allow ample time before services to drop off/sign in your child(ren). Registration will take place in the first floor Temple lobby.

Please provide your children with a snack (not requiring refrigeration). We will provide beverages and a light snack after the Family Service. For infants and toddlers please provide diapering essentials, a change of clothing, food and/or bottles.

Please pick up your children before attending the Rosh Hashanah reception. Children are welcome to attend with their families. Childcare will not be available during this time.

MEMORIAL SERVICES

Yom Kippur Afternoon, Memorial/Yizkor and Concluding Services for members will be held at Sinai at 3:30 pm on Saturday, September 18. An earlier Memorial/Yizkor Service for members and guests will be held at Fourth Presbyterian Church at 1:00 pm. Members may attend either the early Memorial Service at Fourth Presbyterian Church or the later Service at Sinai.

FAMILY SERVICES

Family services are designed for families with children ages 4 through 11. Rabbi Sternfield and Rabbi Levinsky will lead the services at 9:30 am on Thursday, September 9, and at 9:30 am on Saturday, September 18. We will use the Sinai Family High Holy Days Prayerbook for these services. Please indicate how many seats you are reserving on the form found on page 7.

Each service is approximately one hour long and includes traditional holiday music, responsive readings, a shofar service and a story. Because these are very popular services and space is limited, we ask that you request seating for you and your immediate family only. Rabbi Sternfield encourages parents to bring their children ages 11+ to the 5 pm Early Service.

Unfortunately we are not able to accommodate guests at the family services. If you know of families who want to attend our services, please feel free to invite them to join us for any of our monthly Friday evening and/or Sunday morning family services.
